What is Advanced Placement?

- Honors courses prepare students for Advanced Placement level courses.
- AP courses are college-level courses taken in high school.
- ► AP courses are nationally recognized.
- AP exams are taken to potentially earn college credit:
 - score range is 1-5
 - 4 or 5 = credit at most colleges / universities
 - 3 = some colleges / universities award credit for specified areas

AP Credit Transfer Examples

- AP Statistics at ASU
 - Score a 3, 4, or 5 and receive credit for STP 226, 3 college credits
- AP US History at ASU
 - Score a 4 or 5 and receive credit for HIST 109 and 110, 6 college credits
- AP Chemistry at ASU
 - Score a 4 and receive credit for CHEM 113, 4 college credits
 - Score a 5 and receive credit for CHEM 113 and 116, 8 college credits


ARIZONA GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM

The Experience

- Challenging coursework
 - Upper level and college equivalent work
- Increased workload
 - Work ethic is as important as intelligence
 - It's <u>normal</u> for students to struggle initially
 - Students will work harder to earn an A or B



How does dual enrollment work?

Dual Enrollment is an opportunity for eligible high school students to earn lower-division college credit during their regular high school classes. The credits students earn through Dual Enrollment are treated the same as regular college credit (i.e. they can be transferred to other Maricopa Community Colleges, Arizona's state universities, and even some out-of-state colleges). Students will be establishing a college academic record and will be required to report such enrollment to future colleges or universities

To earn college credit, students must pass a dual enrollment class with a C or better. The grade earned will be part of the student's college academic record.

Unlike AP classes, students do not have to pass an exam to earn college credit. College admissions counselors may consider dual credit grades during the admissions process.






The student is responsible for contacting CGCC to have official transcripts sent to other institutions. There is a \$5 copy fee for each transcript. The high school will not be able to provide this documentation. Students and parents should do their own research and due diligence when considering colleges.

FAST FACTS:

- Tuition is \$85/credit hour (average class is 3-5 credits) + \$20 enrollment fee each semester
- Classes can be one semester or full year
- Students are creating a Maricopa Community college transcript by taking dual enrollment courses
- Students dropped from a class due to non-payment of tuition or miss the drop deadline will be assigned a "W" on their college transcript
- Students under 18 must have parental consent
- Dual enrollment classes are college classes with higher academic expectations

Skip Introductory Classes: If you already know your preferred college major, taking a related AP course (and earning a qualifying score) or completing a Dual Enrollment (with C or higher) can help you advance and avoid required introductory courses – so you can move directly into upper-level classes and focus on the work that interests you most.
