**Summer School Philosophy**: It is a goal of Gilbert Public Schools to promote a desire for lifelong learning within our students. In support of this goal, the Elementary Summer School is designed to provide learning opportunities for the students through an engaging, hands-on curriculum. These programs result in successful daily experiences that stimulate and nurture intellectual and social growth. We believe this experience will instill a desire for lifelong learning in our children.

**Summer School Faculty**: Certified Gilbert Public Schools teachers have the first opportunity to apply for Summer School positions. Qualified instructors outside of the district may be hired as well. Each teacher interested in Summer School is required to complete the application and interview process. This ensures the hiring of quality teachers whose philosophy aligns with that of the program.

Summer School Design: Summer School design is determined through a collaboration of parents, students, teachers, and administration. Teachers actively participate in the design of the Summer School by responding to written surveys; involvement on the Summer School Design Team; teaching in Summer School; and providing written evaluations of their Summer School teaching experience. Parents and students participate in the design of Summer School by responding to the parent and student surveys that are sent home at the end of Summer School. To participate in next year's design please respond to the surveys sent home at the end of Summer School. Your responses are appreciated and do make a difference.

### • Elementary Courses (PreK-6):

Students can take a minimum of one class, or a maximum of three classes. Each class is 55 minutes in duration. Please select the grade that your child will be going into next school year. Classes start on the half hour, and end five minutes before the next half-hour mark. During the five-minute passing period, teachers are in the hallways to assist students in getting to their next class. Volunteers will be on campus the first day to help students find their way around. Tuition is on a per-class basis.

## • Jr High <u>Prep</u> Courses (7-8):

Students can take one class. The class is 3 hours in duration. Classes start at 8:30 am and end at 11:30 am.

#### • TUITION FEES:

- The cost per class varies. Please refer to "Course Offerings and Descriptions".
- Additional fees are required for some classes where additional supplies are necessary. Please refer to the "Course Descriptions" for additional fees.
- VISA, MasterCard, American Express and Discover will be accepted, and all classes must be paid for at the time of registration.
- In the event that a class has insufficient enrollment, you will be notified via email and you will receive a refund for the cost of the canceled class. #### **EXPECTATIONS & GUIDELINES**

#### **BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES:**

- Good behavior is essential to learning and should be based upon mutual respect
  for the rights and property of others, respect for those placed in authority, and
  respect for every student. No one will be allowed to jeopardize the health, safety,
  or learning environment of fellow students. Students will be expected to display
  responsible behavior at all times when they are at Summer School.
- All behavior guidelines and discipline codes in the family handbook provided by Gilbert Public Schools are in effect during the Summer School program. Copies of the handbook can be found online at https://www.gilbertschools.net/Page/894
- Students may arrive **no earlier than fifteen (15) minutes before** their first class, nor remain on campus any **longer than fifteen (15) minutes after their last class**.
- Gum and candy are not permitted on campus.
- Roller skates, roller blades, scooters, skateboards, etc. are not permitted on campus.
- Bikes are to be kept in the bike racks and locked with a private lock. Bike racks will be unlocked from 8:15 am until 11:45 am
- Running, pushing, shoving, and other inappropriate behaviors are not permitted.
- Students are not permitted to bring guests on campus.
- No student may leave the campus, other than at the designated dismissal times, without approval from the office.

#### **Summer School Bus Code of Conduct:**

Any student that is found in violation of Gilbert Public Schools student handbook code of conduct and bus procedures and expectations will lose bus privileges for summer school. Students who are not following bus rules and regulations will be removed from the bus.

#### **DRESS CODE:**

- Summer School follows the same dress code as the regular school year. Please note the following guidelines:
  - o Profane or disrespectful writing on clothing or jewelry is not acceptable.
  - Jewelry should not be worn if it presents a safety hazard to self and/or others.
  - Students may not wear clothing or hairstyles that can be hazardous and/or disruptive to the school environment.

- Pictures and/or words on any garment must be in good taste with nothing that is obscene, vulgar, or that promotes anything that is illegal for minors.
- The body shall be adequately covered. Short shorts, bathing suits, bare chests, halter tops, tube tops, tank tops, undershirts, bare midriffs, mesh or sheer garments, etc. are not considered adequate coverage.
- Negative student, group/gang affiliation apparel is not allowed.
   Gang-related personalization is not permitted on hats, on items of clothing or on one's person. This includes anything worn or carried on campus.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Footwear or items of clothing that would damage furniture, floors, walls, etc. will not be allowed (for example: spiked shoes, and black-soled tennis shoes.)

#### ATTENDANCE:

- Due to the fast-paced courses in Summer School, attendance is important. Attendance will be taken daily.
- It is important to be on time. If a student is tardy he/she will need to report to the Summer School Office to be admitted to class.

#### **REFUNDS/SCHEDULE CHANGES:**

- Classes will be carried only upon sufficient enrollment. In the event a class does
  not meet enrollment requirements, you will be notified and full payment will be
  refunded. Please note. that ALL tax credit donations are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- There will be **no refunds** unless enrollment is not sufficient.
- There will be **no schedule changes**. Changing schedules disrupts the learning of our students.

## **Elementary Summer School Transportation**

Transportation for the Elementary Summer School <u>will be offered at no cost.</u>

Pick-up/drop-off locations are going to be available at the following regional elementary school sites: Boulder Creek Elementary, Sonoma Ranch Elementary, Spectrum Elementary, & Oak Tree Elementary. An additional pick-up/drop-off site will be available at Mesquite Junior High to accommodate any junior high students who are also enrolled in the Zone program. Each site will also be hosting Community Education's VIK summer camp programs so that students may conveniently attend summer school during the morning and VIK in the afternoon.

## **Important Information:**

- **Bus routes/exact times** to each of the VIK sites will be communicated in Mid-May.
- <u>Please enroll for a departure bus route and return bus route during registration</u> in order for your child to be placed on the list. The routes are listed by the location where your child will be picked up (departure) and dropped off (return).
- Students must be enrolled in **all three class sessions** in order to use the bus transportation.
- VIK childcare services are provided at each regional site for an additional fee.
