Hello SSE families

We miss all of your students' smiling faces. Here are some ways to stay healthy and safe during this extended time away from school.

Staying healthy guidelines:

***Hand washing** is the single most effective way to kill germs, prevent their spread and keep from getting sick. Wash often with soap and water for **20 seconds**, or the time it takes to sing Happy Birthday. <https://www.cdc.gov/handwashing/campaign.html>

Aside from handwashing, children and adults should also be careful when coughing, sneezing or wiping or blowing your nose.

***Cover your mouth and nose completely.** Cough or sneeze into your shirt! * Use your arm or elbow if needed. * Use tissues when you sneeze or cough. * Dispose of the tissue immediately! ***Wash your hands afterward**

Exercise at least 30 minutes a day. Be active together. It will get you moving, and kids love to play with their parents. Riding your bike or going for a walk is a great way to stay active. Did you know?

When choosing a book for your student to read, use the 5 finger rule. Randomly select a page in the book and begin to read. Every time a word is not known, put up a finger. If all five fingers are up before finishing the page, the book is too difficult and a different book should be selected. If only 2-3 fingers are up, the book should be ok and not frustrate your reader.
