- Schools are obligated to find ways to serve all students, even during times of disruption when remote learning requires students to connect from home.
- Schools are responsible for meeting the needs of all students, including the distinctive needs of students from low-income backgrounds, students with disabilities, and English language learners.
- Decisions are best made by consulting with those closest to the problem, including school leaders, health officials, and community leaders.

- Schools will reopen in the 2020–21 academic year.
- Reopened schools will need modifications based on guidance from national and state health officials.
- Plans should take into account both short and long-term solutions.
